**Leave of Absence:**

Apologies for inability to attend the meeting were received and leave of absence was granted to Mr. Mohd. Hussain Patel, Mr. Aqeel Hafiz, Mr. Moinul Haq Chowdhry, Mr. Irfan Kazi, Dr. Shafi Shaikh and Mr. Shahbaz Alam Siddiqui.

**Meeting commenced with recitation of Holy Quran by Vice President, Dr. Shaikh Abdullah.**

**69. Minutes:**

Minutes of the meeting held on February 6, 2016 were confirmed as having been correctly recorded.

70. Business arising out of the Minutes:

71. Review of Activities:

(a) Akbar Peerbhoy College of Commerce & Economics:

Principal informed the Board that this year 159 students took admission in B.Sc. (IT) against the capacity of 360. There is good flow in the BMS Course. President stated that we may approach University of Mumbai for increase intake capacity in the BMS. Principal further informed that under the leadership of Prof. Lakdawala, a team of teachers were sent to various Junior Colleges for promotion of Professional Courses like BMS, BMM, B.Sc. (IT) and B.Sc. (Computer Sci.).

Executive Chairman expressed concern over late coming of staff in the college and directed Principal to ensure that teachers come in time. President said Principal need to be punctual as a leader to monitor punctuality of the staff both teaching and non-teaching.

Hon. Treasurer asked if accounts of the College have been submitted. Principal replied that accounts were finalized and submitted to the Head Office.

Board was informed that Principal, Dr. Shaikh Mehmood Hasan was appointed by University of Mumbai as Vice Chancellor's Nominee on the selection panel to select Principal for eight colleges.

(b) Begum Jamila Haji Abdul Haq College of Home Science:

Board was informed that getting NOC for Begum Jamila Haji Abdul Haq College of Home Science from Higher and Technical Department, Government of Maharashtra is still pending. Online admission portal is

reflecting verso address, therefore students and parents are getting confused. If we get NOC, then we can change our address of C.S.T. on the online admission portal. This will help us to reach our full capacity of 360 seats.

72. Any other matter:

President informed the Board that till last year we used to admit 51% of the seats under the Minority Quota from the eligible candidates, who had appeared for the CET on inter-se-merit. The Government used to send 29% from the Central Admission Process (CAP) and the institutions were allowed to admit 20% seats as Institutional quota. Government of Maharashtra has passed the Maharashtra Unaided Private Professional Institutions – Regulation of Admission and Fees Act 2015. As per this Act, admission to our unaided Professional & Technical Institutions would be done entirely by the “Admission Regulating Authority’ through Central Admission Process (CAP), which means 80% of the candidates would be admitted through ‘Admission Regulating Authority’. The 20% Institutional Quota has also to be filled up from the candidates who have appeared for CET.

For the sake of information, President informed that One NGO, Citizen Forum for Sanctity in Education, which is headed by Mr. Sanjay Kelkar, BJP-MLA had sent complaints about 17 Institutions throughout Maharashtra, pointing out various deficiencies. Although academic performance as well as placements of M.H. Saboo Siddik are excellent, the NGO targeted the College for ulterior motives. In respect of M.H. Saboo Siddik College of Engineering, they have pointed out deficiencies of land and infrastructure etc. As a result of the complaint, M.H. Saboo Siddik College of Engineering was placed in ‘No Admission Category’. We tried our best to convince the AICTE Authorities that as per the current FSI of 5, we fulfil the requirement of built up area.

Since the AICTE did not give favourable reply to our plea, we filed a writ petition in the High Court of Bombay. Sr. Counsel, Mr. Rafiq Dada appeared before the Vacation Bench of High Court even though he had never appeared before the Vacation Bench so far. High Court directed AICTE to give final hearing on 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2016 and pass an order on or before 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2016. Matter has been kept for final hearing on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2016. President appeared before the Standing Complaint Committee (SSC) on 23<sup>rd</sup> May in New Delhi.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
