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MESSAGE FROM THE DESK OF EDITOR

English Language and the Arab World

Dr. Syed Mohd Abbas Rizvi



Arab world has been a world to reckon with for the glory of its past history, its culture and lately for its petroleum springs. Gradually, however, its glory gave way to the rising Western influence because of science and technology. Europe and America became the standard for the modern outlook on life and living. English took the central stage as an international medium of communication. It is therefore very natural that the Arab students were attracted from all over the Arab world to offer English language in many universities and colleges of their homelands. They are widely interested in learning English, but as a result of their poor learning and slow progress in acquiring fluency, the opinions among the professors of English are divided. Some of them are of the opinion that English can best be learned by teaching linguistics without letting them offer English literature. They fear that the cultural and social values embodied in the English literary tradition would badly affect the moral values held by Muslim Arab students. Western literature, being culturally superior and globally accepted will threaten the ethical code of the Arab students. There have been quite a large number of seminars, workshops and conferences in criticism of the dominance of English literature over language and linguistic courses. Some linguists claim that the predominance of literature has been the main cause of failure of the English departments in the Arab world to train the students in English language and make them fit to meet the needs for English as a language of science, technology, business and international

Professor Zughoul asserts—

Rarely does a department in the Third World Country offers a solid language training, i.e. training in reading comprehension, listening comprehension, term paper writing or speech. It is assumed that the incoming student is proficient in the language and he needs no further language training. This unrealistic assumption is, to a great extent, responsible for the failure of the English departments in the Third World countries to respond to the needs of the communities they are supposed to serve. communication. A large number of linguists argue that the literature impedes the students' progress in learning language. It is assumed that bulk of the curriculum in these departments consists of literature. Professor M. Zughoul examined the curriculum in a study in 1987 and he concluded that the English Arab departments of the universities of Baghdad, Iraq, Damascus, Syria, Kuwait, Jordan, Amman etc are heavily dominated by literature. Even the syllabus of the secondary schools has been observed to have the predominance of English literature.

After graduation, student's knowledge of English and American literature carries no direct relevance to their work. It is held that on Arab graduate in English often goes to teaching profession or at best into clerical or administrative job where literature is hardly useful. It is only the language competence that works in many circumstances. It is concluded that the language competence alone prepares him to meet the needs of his/her Arab community. So the language teaching must be kept separate from the teaching of literature. It is axiomatic to believe that literature deviates from natural language, which led Zughoul and other like-minded linguists to question the validity of widely teaching English literature in the English departments of the Third World countries. Particularly the language of poetry is dismissed by Zughoul as too deviant for his own and other linguists' attention. For him, the literature uses language which is much different from the normal, natural, everyday conversation of the common members of a speech community. Instead of simplifying, explaining and revealing the meaning, literature of all kinds

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(poetry, short-stories, novels and plays) makes language more complex and difficult for the students to learn.

Opinions in favour of Literature as an essential component of teaching English as a language to Arab Students:

Linguistic researchers such as Mahmud Saleh support the teaching of literature in the Arab World. He conducted a survey by distributing questions to 118 Arab students graduating in English. Based in his analysis M. Saleh writes the following.

The student survey shows that language skills seem to develop through studying literature in English. The positive impact of literature upon language skills is by no means novel, since students exercise or practice all of the skills in literature courses. During a literature class, they are required to listen to what an instructor is saying, they must jot down notes, they often ask or answer questions, and they are frequently required to read passages relevant to the idea(s) under consideration. (Saleh, M.H.1986:25)

Marwan M. Obeidat, the Associate Professor of American literature at the United Arab Emirates University, in his article 'Language vs. Literature' observes:

My students tend to agree that literature helps them acquire a native like competence in English, express their ideas in good English, learn the features of modern English, learn how the English linguistic system is used for communication, see how idiomatic expressions are used, speak clearly, precisely and concisely and become more proficient in English, as well as become creative, critical and analytical learners.

Mthem with the Arab students and help them develop subtle and sophisticated language knowledge. The language-oriented courses, according to Professor Joseph John (1989) cannot provide students with much language competence, with "an awareness of the full range of its expressive potential." Mere knowledge of the grammatical and other rules are insufficient. Prof. Joseph John rightly asserts that such rules cannot teach students "idiomatically sound and therefore good English." Marwan M. Obeidat rightly observes that the pre-occupation of many language specialists with grammar and phonology as a means of teaching good English has, in fact, resulted in the "subordination of vocabulary teaching to grammar teaching" and has caused an imbalance between grammar and lexis. D.A. Wilkin perceptively points out "while without grammar very little can be said, without vocabulary nothing can be conveyed." Without immediate acquaintance with words and idioms in their actual context of literature, the formal knowledge of grammar and grammatical rules alone are useless, if not worthless. The pressing need of an Arab graduate whose major field of study is English to find a job as school teacher, or a translator or even as diplomat, mere linguistic rules and principles, theories and structures are fruitless unless they are also taught literature and how to analyze and appreciate foreign culture and people. The inadequacies of the Arab learners can be overcome only if they are exposed to English literature through various forms of English as found in fiction, poetry, drama and essay. In the case of linguistics, the experience of the students, according to Joseph John, is derivative and remote while in the case of literature, his experience is direct and immediate. Literature has much more to offer than language would normally do. The structure of language is not identical with the structure of literature. Each structure complements the other but does not and cannot coincide with each other. In fact, literary awareness provides extra features that help improve the students' command of English and ability to use English freely as a cultural, social, intellectual and psychological medium of expression. Prof. Joseph John goes on to argue that linguistics would want students to learn about language rather than the creative producers of language. Students should not, therefore, be forbidden (as proposed by Prof. M. Zughouli) to study literature for it is only from literature that Arab students can obtain the skills he needs.

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The Arab World is fast catching up with English as it is getting exposed to the global impact of English in the field of media, entertainment, business, culture and politics. The departments of English in various Arab Universities and Colleges have been improving and modifying their syllabi from time to time to give the best results and the new changes have worked well in making the Arab students a welcome member of the global community. arwan M. Obeidat also discovered to his surprise that the number of courses offered in language and linguistics is far more than of literature in the curriculum of the universities of UAE, Kuwait, Bahrain, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Damascus, Syria, Tunisia, Morocco and Alexandria (Egypt). He says that this led him to conclude that the fairly good lack of interest in literature is the main cause of the poor learning of English language in Arab World. As a specialist in literature, he supports the view that literature not language is what is needed for the English departments to upgrade and streamline Western Onslaught.

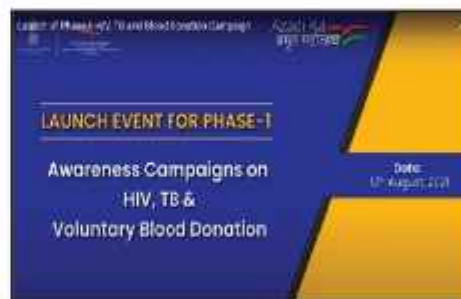
3. Launch of Phase I – HIV, TB and Blood donation Campaign

The resource person of the webinar were Ms. Nazneen Chunawala, Ms. Alpa Doshi Psychologist & counselor from NGO-Mpower. In the webinar, they discussed about importance of maintaining mental health as well as encouraged help seeking behavior.

2. On the occasion of National Girl child Day, in the month of January one week Workshop was organized in association with DLLE through Mpower. The title of the webinar was "Thriving During Pandemic". The purpose of program was to give information about life skills to cope up with stress and worries arise in daily routine life. The workshop covered the topics like Digital Well being and Substance Use & Mental Health which is very relevant to the youth. They motivated students for self care by engaging in productive activity and shared the strategies to build resilience.

3. To spread Awareness About Hygiene And Cleanliness Behavior To Be Followed During

Menstrual Cycle By The Adolescent (GIRLS STUDENTS) of neighboring school, two days program was conducted by Snehal Vacha under URJJA project of Aditya Birla Education Foundation, where she spoke about natural changes in the female productive system and precautions and hygiene habits to be followed to avoid infections or diseases. She gave the demo of how to use sanitary napkin as well as free sanitary napkin were distributed to encourage the use for health and hygiene.

4. The webinar on the topic "The significance of nutrition" by Chief Nutritionist Ms. Jinal Patel from Apollo Spectrum Hospital was organized on 8th February 2022. The speaker presented the topic in a very lucid manner. The speaker highlighted the significance of diet and exercise to keep oneself healthy. She advised to avoid fast food and flavored food. She attended questions of female students and gave satisfactory answer.

5. To help the students to overcome the stress and anxiety during or before SSC and HSC examination counseling session was conducted with the male and female students of neighboring school. She asked the difficulties faced by the students and gave certain suggestions to overcome examination phobia.

6. On eve of International Women's Day, the gender sensitization programs was organized. On the first day, Short Films On Gender Issues were screened. The students were asked to share their observation and learning out of movie. On the second day the Talk Show- How To Remain Fit was conducted.

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7. To empower the female students, Two Days Self Defense Workshop was organized. On the first day, the resource person gave information about kickboxing to male and female students. On second day, he took workshop on self defense for female students. He asked the girls to learn self defense mechanism to develop confidence and self protection. This will help you to handle various uninvited challenges of daily life. He gave the demo of certain technique and asked the girls to actively participate.

8. In association with IT department, the ICC Celebrated International Day Of Women & Girls's Science In Science on 11th February 2022. On this occasion our team visited for Anjuman-I-Islam's Junior colleges offering science to provide hands-on-training practical session on Internet of Things (IOT) exclusively for girl's students to promote awareness about science & technology among girl students.

9. To provide easy access of quality sanitary napkin during menstrual cycle in college premises as well as to empower and create awareness about women's health college got in charity five Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine from Aditya Birla Education Foundation under URJA project. Two machines were installed in girls common room and ladies wash room respectively. Remaining three machines were installed in neighboring school, home science college and junior college located at CST campus under the same management of our college.

10. On Friday, 24th September 2019, the Internal Complaint Committee with the help of Nagpada Police station conducted the program on “Safety Measures for female students against cyber crime & Frauds” for the female students of all section of the college through virtual platform. The purpose

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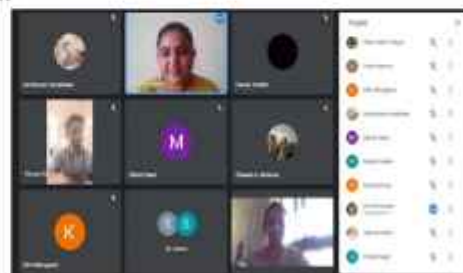
Report of DLLE of 2022-2023

The students asked various questions to doctor and the Dr. Jeet Savla satistisfactorily answered all their questions. The camp was successful.



5. VISIT TO JUVENILE HOME (DONGRI):

To sensitise students about social issues, Department of lifelong learning and Extension has organised a visit to Dongri Juvenile home, a home for rehabilitation of the minor children on 4th January 2023 at 11.00 a.m. 35 students along with Professor Vaishali Bankar and Dr.Kirti Kumar Pimpliskar. Dongri jail is a British era jail on jail road, Dongri an area in Mumbai. The jail was built by the British in the eighteenth century as on 1804. Originally located within the ramparts, building of a separate jail was first suggested by Aungler in 1671. The people initially detained here included both, Indians as well as British nationals. For instance, the Provost Marshal John Hall endured confinement in the Dongri Prison for drunk in March 1701. The majority of its inmates over time were Indians, particularly those accused of sedition (often independence fighters) or those who were in custody awaiting trial, especially at the end of the nineteenth and the beginning of the twentieth centuries. It now functions as a juvenile delinquent's home for children who are below 18 years of age, convicted of crimes. To prevent conflicts and influence, the Children in Conflict with the Law are always kept apart from the Children in Need of Care and Protection in the boys' area. They go about their daily tasks, which include praying, meditating, eating, taking part in vocational training, and engaging in leisure activities, according to a defined timetable. After being accepted into the home, a child spends 15 to 20 days in orientation, during which time the teachers work to determine his interests and create a career plan for him. The vocational programmes offered at Umer Khadi include carpentry, electrical training, mobile and computer repair, and tailoring. However, because there are only 3-4 juvenile offenders in the females' section, the juveniles and those who require protection

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The girls go through a similar orientation and training process, but as part of their vocational training, they can choose to take classes in fashion design and beauty parlours. When we visited, the girls were all taking part in prayers, singing, and garba as part of the Navaratri celebrations, which were in full swing. We also learned that the boys' division had recently held a Ganpati celebration. We observed many distinctions between the girls' area and the boys' section. When we invited them to draw each other, the girls were more eager to get started and showed more interest in drawing. Additionally, they created more elaborate sketches that were filled with information and patterns. The students took keen interest in visit and asked various questions to officers of the juvenile home. The visit was successful. Diagnosis: most diagnoses are made by identifying the appearance of the (worm) or eggs in (files). Due to the large quantity of eggs laid (physicians) can (diagnose) using only one or two fecal smears the diagnosis is usually incidental when the host passes a worm in the stool or vomit. The eggs can be seen in smears of fresh faeces examined there are various techniques to concentrate them first or increase their visibility, such as the ether sedimentation method or the (koto technique). The eggs have characteristic shape they are oval with a thick, mamillated shell (covered with rounded) measuring 35-50 micrometer in diameter and 40-70 in length. During pulmonary disease, larvae may be found in fluids aspirated and the lungs. While blood cells counts may demonstrate peripheral (eosinophilia), this is common in many parasitic infection and is not specific to ascuiasis. On x-ray 15-35cm long filling defects sometimes with whirled appearance. **Transmission:** The source of infection is from objects which have been contaminated with faecal matter containing eggs. Ingestion of infective eggs from soil contaminated with human faeces or contaminated vegetables and water is the infective eggs may occur on other objects such as hands, money and furniture. Transmission from human to human by direct contact is impossible. Transmission comes through municipal recycling of wastewater into crop fields. This is quite common in contaminated vegetables. A 1986 outbreak of ascuiasis in (Italy) was traced to irresistible wastewater recycling used to grow (ballan) vegetables exports. The number of oval (eggs) in (sewage) or in crops that were irrigated with raw or partially treated sewage, is a measure of the degree of ascuiasis incidence. For example In a study published in 1992, municipal wastewater in (Riyadh, Saudi Arabia) detected over 100 eggs per litre of wastewater and in (Zechusluvakia) was sewage is used to fertilise crop in one field study (Marrakech Morocco, when raw sewage fields, ascuiis eggs were detected at the rate of 1.8 eggs/kg in radish. A similar study in the 4.63 eggs/kg in mint, 0.7 eggs/kg in radish. A similar study in the same area showed that 73% of children working on the farms were infected with helminths particularly ascuiis, probably as a result of exposure to the raw sewage. **Causes:** ascuiasis isn't spread directly from persons to person. Instead, a person has to come into contact with soil mixed with human faeces that contain ascuiasis eggs or infected water. In many developing countries, human faeces are used for fertilizer or poor sanitary facilities allow human waste to mix with soil on yards, ditches and fields. Small children often play in dirt, and infection can occur if they put their dirty fingers in their mouths. Unwashed fruits or vegetables grown in contaminated soil also can transmit the ascuiasis eggs.
